NJ STATE LEGISLATURE - UPDATE ON PLANNED PARENTHOOD

Despite Governor Chris Christie's veto of an identical bill in February, the New Jersey Senate passed a bill to restore the \$7.5 million in funding to Planned Parenthood on May 23. The new bill, #S2899, passed 26 -13, just one vote short of a veto-proof majority, with all of the Senate Democrats -- plus Republicans Diane Allen (R – 7 Burlington) and Jennifer Beck (R –12 Red Bank) – voting yes. Both Senate and Assembly Republicans blasted the vote, saying the bill never received a committee hearing.

"I think it's an outrage that they introduced a bill and bypassed the normal legislative process to sneak [it] through without the public being aware of it," said New Jersey Right to Life executive director Marie Tasy. "The reason they [rushed] this bill through is because they [were] hoping New Jersey citizens [weren't] paying attention." Despite the short notice, about 100 pro-life advocates still assembled to protest the vote on a rainy Monday afternoon in Trenton, thanks in part to New Jersey Right to Life news e-blasts.

In a written statement last Thursday, Senate President Sweeney called Weinberg "a tireless advocate for women." Ironically, he made this remark only days after an Open Public Records Act request revealed that Planned Parenthood of Mercer County – which operates just up the street from the State House in Trenton – was cited for numerous health and safety violations on March 10th and 11th. The 39-page report revealed that New Jersey Department of Health inspectors uncovered, among numerous other violations: improperly used syringes and compounds; improperly trained pain-management and health-care counseling staff; failures to require physical exams for the staffers, including failures to screen for rubella and TB; failure to have adequate infection controls in place; failure to maintain hot running water in patient care areas, and failure to properly sterilize medical instruments devices, including a vaginal ultrasound probe.

Tasy has noted that Weinberg's election campaigns are all supported by Planned Parenthood. Weinberg has publicly alleged that cutting Planned Parenthood funding cuts off poor and uninsured women from medical care.

"Shame on Loretta Weinberg for scaring the residents of New Jersey that the safety net is not there," said Senator Michael Doherty (R – 23 Washington Twp.) in a speech on the statehouse steps May 23rd. "Not only can you go to the federally qualified healthcare center, New Jersey also has NJ-CEED (Cancer Education & Early Detection Program). You can make up 250% of the poverty level, whether you have a job or not, whether you have insurance or not, you can still be covered by CEED and get a prescription for all kinds of cancer screening, cervical, breast, prostate...whatever you need. We also have charity clinics." Doherty also went on to praise Drs. John & Alieta Eck and the Zarephath Health Center in Somerset County, which provides all kinds of health care to the poor and uninsured. "Shame on you, Loretta Weinberg, stop your lies!" he concluded.
