UPDATE ON PLANNED PARENTHOOD

As the Knights of Columbus celebrates the "Day of the Unborn Child" on March 25th, there have been many new developments on the pro-life front with respect to the Planned Parenthood organization.

The group 'Live Action', headed by pro-life warrior Lila Rose, produced another undercover videotape exposing a Planned Parenthood clinic in Perth Amboy, NJ condoning statutory rape and prostitution. The NJ Right to Life organization, along with the Knight of Columbus and other pro-life groups, picketed in front of the clinic on February 14th to raise awareness about the atrocities going on in this organization.

As a result of this latest videotape, Representative Mike Pence (R-Indiana) has added an amendment to the current spending bill being debated by the House of Representatives. The amendment calls for defunding the federal taxpayer money given to Planned Parenthood for the remainder of fiscal year 2011. The following blog posting, from www.CatholicVote.org, is a quick overview of the situation:

Taxpayers won an important victory in the U.S. House by garnering the votes needed to cut federal funding to Planned Parenthood for the rest of this year.

The battle now turns to the United States Senate. Getting the 51 votes to cut off funding for Planned Parenthood will be extremely difficult. Not all Senate Republicans are pro-life and not every Senate Democrat is 100% pro-abortion.

Some have argued that Planned Parenthood does not use any taxpayer money for abortion. But whether these funds will be used directly to perform abortions is irrelevant. America's #1 abortion provider has forfeited any right to taxpayer dollars. The organization is not only the single largest provider of abortion in America, they have been caught on video repeatedly advising underage women on how to evade the law, avoid statutory rape reporting requirements (a federal crime), and have counseled under cover investigators on how to carry out a prostitution ring with underage, undocumented women.

Finally, the facts are plain: our government is broke. Every government program receiving our hard earned tax dollars deserves to be scrutinized, scaled back, and in many case, eliminated altogether. Taxpayer subsidies to Planned Parenthood must be eliminated. We simply cannot afford to give Planned Parenthood \$366 million a year, nearly one-third of their annual budget.

The spending bill vote now moves to the Senate where it might fail, but the House of Representatives must be commended for taking a stand and using the power available to it to help bring the abortion industry in this country to it's knees.

\$3 Scratch-off NJ lottery tickets will be given to all donors.

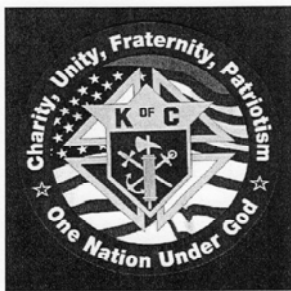
SILVER ROSE PRAYER SERVICE
