As a newly minted member of the K of C Motorcycle Ministry, I wanted to relay a message that was sent by one of our members recently.

A few weeks ago I went on a motorcycle run. It was The Annual 9-11 Memorial Run organized by 'Tramontin Harley-Davidson' in Hope, NJ. The run ran from Hope, NJ to Brooklyn, NY. So I met my friend Kurt there and we partook in the ride. Sure, we gave our time, our money (proceeds went to **Operation Care Package** and the **Billy Lake Cancer Fund**) and had fun riding our motorcycles.

The ride was well run and well organized. The public, the participants and the spectators were all great. Fire Departments hung flags from their ladders for us, entire towns came out to wave at us as we rode by, and it was like "small town America" on the 4<sup>th</sup> of July but on a much larger scale. It certainly made you proud to be an American although the reason of remembrance was a somber one. Somewhere along the ride, something else happened, something that I wasn't expecting.

We are riding in formation, it was police escorted so we really had most of the road to ourselves, the occasional car would crowd you from time to time but most people were understanding and supportive (did I mention there were reportedly 1,500 bikers riding?).

As the cars past or were past by us, people would honk (usually in support) or wave or give you the "thumbs up" but there was this one car. They came up on me slowly and kept pace with me. There was what seemed like a Grandma & Grandpa in the car, a mom and two young kids.

I looked over at them and gave them a nod to thank them for supporting us. Just as I said, the Grandpa gave me a "thumbs up" and was honking the horn, the ladies were clapping and applauding and smiling ear to ear and the kids were going nuts in the back. I remember thinking to myself, WOW; these people are really into this. I kept riding as they slowly pulled farther ahead.

Then it hit me. I realized why their reactions were so strong. Grandpa had a personalized license plate, it was the state issued Knights of Columbus license plate. Out of 1,500 bikers, I was the only one wearing a Knights of Columbus Motorcycle Ministry vest with our "colors" emblazoned on my back.

They may have been excited about the motorcycles, they may have been personally touched by the cause the run supported, but I know they were thrilled to see a Brother Knight in a light they may have not seen before.

So next time you are at the council, remember, being a Knight is not about the bar, it is not about raffles or such. Being a Knight is about like-minded Catholic gentlemen (and their families) "**In service to one, In service to all**". Rosanda Grau, who is the current Director of Development & Fundraising for [Life Choices](#), wrote the following article. This article appeared in the [August 2010 Tri-annual newsletter for Life Choice Resource Center](#).

### ***“The Story of Janelle”***

It was 11am when she called us. She had an appointment for an abortion at 1pm and she needed to see a counselor right away. It was to be her 3<sup>rd</sup> attempt at an abortion but, as with her previous tries, the voice inside her pleaded for another way. Her mother, her boyfriend, her best friend, all those she trusted, steered - almost pushed her towards that clinic. But her heart and her soul brought her to Life Choices.

This was the beginning of what was to be an epic battle of wills between a young woman, her family and friends and an entire culture that does not look kindly on unwed motherhood. It was the start of a noble journey for this beautiful girl who wanted her child so badly she fought off almost everyone in her world who was entirely against her decision. But she did not do it alone. Deb was with her every step of the way; and as each day brought more resistance and pressure from her mother, or yet another broken promise from her boyfriend, so it also gave Deb a chance to reveal a deeper level of compassion and to gain a higher level of trust. As Janelle's family bonds grew weaker and at times fell into chaos, the bond with her child and her courage grew stronger. The truth is we all came to love Janelle and the child that lives inside her – that silent, hidden hero who happily does what unborn babies do best...grow, kick, suck their thumbs and dream.

To date, the Lord in His mercy has taken care of the details by moving hearts and opening minds. Janelle's family has moved towards acceptance, and after several months of living in special housing she has moved back home. Now we joyfully wait...for the little hands, the little feet and for that tiny little face to finally have the chance to look into the eyes of his mother.

Having had a personal connection with this center in the past, I can attest to the absolute loving and caring support that this center provides to expecting and new mother's. 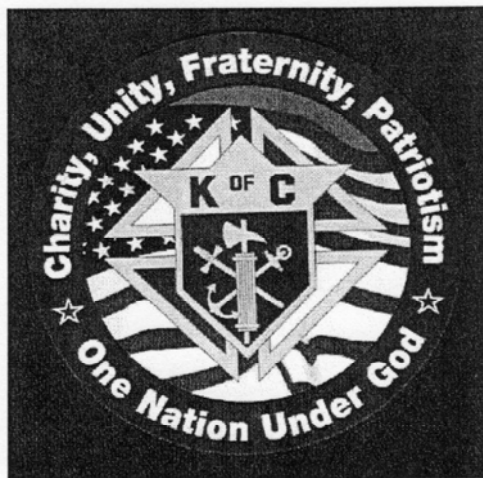
